Plastic surgery magic keeps TV's Jeannie looking young

DREAM OF JEANNIE star Barbara Eden is 83 years old - but you'd never know it.

The stunning TV legend looks fabulous, and she didn't use her character's magical powers to look nearly half her age. Instead, experts say, Barbara had the help of some good plastic surgery.

"She appears to have had a face-lift, causing her neckline to be exceedingly sharp for her age," says Dr. Tony Youn, a Troy, Mich., cosmetic surgeon.

"She also appears to have had some fat injections into her cheeks to look quite plump.

"Her nose looks thin, possibly from a rhinoplasty. I also suspect she's had her upper eyelids lifted as well, as there is minimal skin for somebody her age."

Philadelphia plastic surgeon Dr. Lyle Back believes the blonde beauty has had minimal work -

"just enough to keep up with the aging process."

He says she's had fat or filler added to her cheeks to "perpetuate a natural look and avoid detection as the years pass.

"Her arched, nicely shaped and elevated eyebrows may have had a little help - a mini brow-lift or some Botox only - nothing major."

While Back doesn't see signs of a "face-lift or neck-lift," she could have had a "mini lift," he notes. "Such a procedure provides for very nice improvements that come off as never aging rather than as desperately trying to turn back the clock," the doctor says.

Eden, who starred with Larry Hagman in the mid-1960s sitcom about a curvy genie captivated by an Air Force officer, claims eating right and exercise are her secrets to beating Father Time.

"I spin three times a week for an hour," she says. "Then I work with a trainer for half an hour with weights. It's important to lift weights for your bones."

The thrice-wed actress has also weathered tragedies. She gave birth to a stillborn child, and her 35-year-old son, Matthew, with first hubby, actor Michael Ansara, died of a drug overdose. But she's

kept her sparkle and allure.

As GLOBE previously reported, President Bill Clinton, who's 15 years her junior, was spellbound by her when they met at a charity ball in Vienna in 2013!

"Bill's always had the hots for Barbara," a pal said.

Adds another source, "Barbara is incredible. She looks like a woman half her age."
